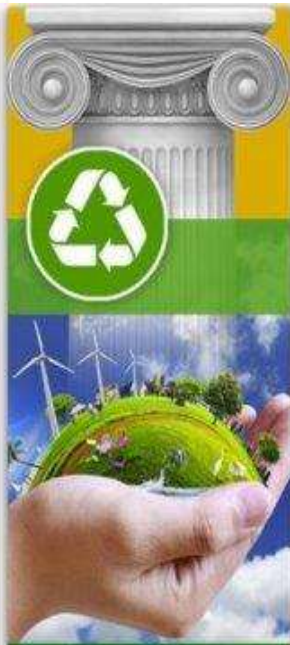

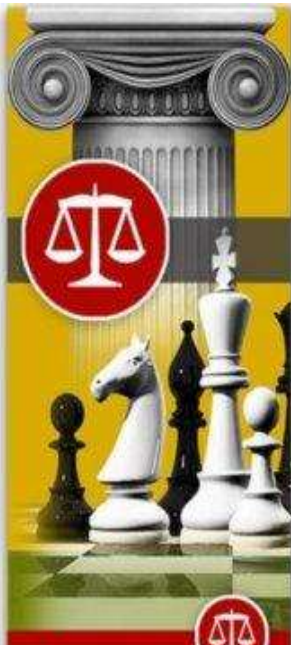

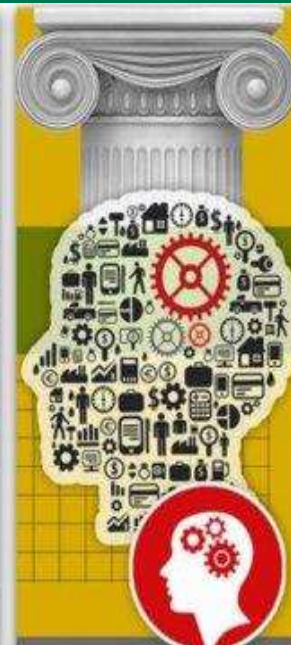

Summary**

Overview of SA economy

- The National Treasury projects real economic growth of **5.1 per cent** in 2021, following an expected contraction of **6.4 per cent** in 2020.
- Real GDP growth is expected to moderate to **1.8 per cent** in 2022, **1.6 per cent** in 2023 and 1.7 per cent in 2024.
- South Africa experienced its largest recorded decline in economic output in 2020 due to the strict COVID-19 lockdown.
- Real GDP contracted by **7.2 per cent** in 2020 compared to **0.1 per cent** increase in 2019.
- It is expected to increase by **6.2 per cent** in 2021/22 and moderate by an average increase of **1.7 per cent** over the 2022/23 MTEF.
- **The main risks to the economic outlook are slowdown in economic growth.**
- The evolution of **COVID-19** and slow progress in vaccine rollout reinforces uncertainty and poses risks to economic recovery.
- **The war between Europe will further constrain the economy.**
- Slow implementation of structural reforms continues to weigh on business confidence and private investment.
- **Electricity supply constraints**, which could worsen over the short term, will drag on economic growth. **In contrast, progress on energy reforms poses upside risks to fixed investment and the overall economic outlook.**
- A further deterioration in the public finances due to **various spending pressures** and the materialization of contingent liabilities could trigger further credit rating downgrades.

Tariffs Increase for (Next financial year 2022/23)

- For the next financial year (**2022/23 financial year**), consideration was given to the **high international oil prices (over \$100 per barrel)** and the **weaker South African currency (above R15 to the US dollar)**. These **two economic variables** result in higher inflation and is required to be considered in the tariff setting.
- As a result, the tariff for services (other than electricity and water) will increase by **5.3%** which is CPI plus **0.5%**.
- **Water tariffs** will increase by **9%** which is the tariff increase by the Lepelle Northern Water of **8.5%** plus **0.5%**.
- **Electricity tariffs** will increase by **9.6%** as approved by **NERSA**. (No additional percentage will be added to this increase).

Sewer and Refuse billing

- Due to challenges experienced in obtaining reliable data to bill refuse and sewer , The Municipality is embarking on **changing the variables used in billing** of refuse and sewer on non residential properties.

Challenges experienced are as follows

- Properties are extended without following proper approval process resulting in the Municipality using old data to bill customers, this resulted in audit queries.
- Data not verifiable through external sources requires physical verification only which is costly to the municipality and the cost of verification are not recoverable in any way

Sewer and Refuse billing...(2)

- Variables to be used in billing of refuse will be the extent or land area of the property .
- The use of the floor area and size of the refuse container , sewer points , number of pupil or residents will no longer be used.

IMPACT ANALYSIS ON CUSTOMER

- Approximately 2871 customer will be affected by the changes.
- The majority of customers will be impacted by the changes because the information used in billing customers from the previous years were not accurate and in some instances were outdated .
- A total of 491 customers will experience an increase above **100%** , The majority of this properties did not have data the unit used in billing refuse was 1
- A total of 226 customers will experience **50%** increase while the remainder are below 50%.
- The impact on customers was mitigated by applying the sliding scale when charging for refuse and sewer

New Charges

The structure of the new tariffs to be implemented from July 2022

The structure of the new tariffs to be implemented from July 2022 will be as follows

Sewer additional charge for non residential

- Basic charges = R700.00
- On an erf with a surface area not exceeding 500m² = R127.44
- Thereafter, per 500m² or part thereof, up to 8000m² of the surface area of the erf:= R127.44
- Thereafter, per 1 000m² or part thereof, of the surface area of the erf= R19.89

Refuse additional charge for Non residential

- On an erf with a surface area not exceeding 300m² = R441.57
- Thereafter, per 300m² or part thereof, up to 9300m² of the surface area of the erf:= R122.64
- Thereafter, per 1 000m² or part thereof, of the surface area of the erf = R 87.00

Management of Shock

- A **100% discount/rebate** will accompany these new tariffs for the next **4 financial years**
- The new rates will only come into effect from 2025/26 on a phase in approach
